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School Counselling Program

Children and young people sometimes find living in our demanding, complex world difficult to negotiate. This can impact their social, emotional and educational development.

Our school counselling program provides specialised psychological and counselling services to primary and secondary schools. It helps identify difficulties early and tailor strategies that assist with the healthy emotional and intellectual development of students.

We have a team of experienced and qualified counsellors and psychologists trained in best practice techniques.

About school counselling

School counsellors provide professional assistance to students, parents, and staff. School counsellors work individually with students providing confidential counselling to support them in developing their own skills to resolve emotional, behavioural and interpersonal difficulties. Counsellors also work collaboratively with parents and teachers to enhance the student’s wellbeing and overall school experience.

School counselling services are provided at your school and are available to all members of the school community. Having a school counsellor at your school assists those children, and their families, who may not otherwise be able to access counselling.

School counsellors are equipped to assist anyone who experiences difficulty with:

- conflict, anger, grief and loss
- depression and anxiety
- self-esteem
- school refusal
- developmental and academic concerns
- family issues (eg: separation/divorce/relationships)
- social skills and peer relationships
- bullying
- behavioural problems

Our qualified school counsellors provide a range of services including:

- Student counselling and therapy
- Parent and teacher consultation
- Small group programs
- Professional development seminars for teachers
- Parenting and information seminars for parents

Cognitive assessments

Educational and cognitive assessments are available through CatholicCare to assist with planning for educational and behavioural needs and for applications for funding support.

Assessment reports include:

- An assessment conducted on-site at the school
- A comprehensive written report
- A feedback session for parents and teachers
